I. Communicating in English well and Speaking English well are different

Fact: Japanese are intelligent, there are Japanese Nobel Peace Prize winners, the Shinkansen, and world-class architecture.

However, many(most?) Japanese do not communicate in English well.

People from developing countries often communicate better than the Japanese. Why do Japanese professionals fail so badly at communicating in English?

"... may have self confidence in the language classroom, but using their language skills in the real world may be quite a different thing."

Means it doesn't work!



English Communicative Success: This does not work...

" It is possible for students to score very high on the TOEFL, but not be able to use oral or written English in context."

Means it doesn't work!

"Many examinees become expert in taking language tests, but do not learn how to use the language." Means it doesn't work!
"TOEFL and TOEIC tests operate in an "artificial reality." Means it doesn't work!
The Japanese have not had a realistic non-Japanese environment to develop communication skills – until NOW!



English Communicative Success: This does not work...

ETS(an American company) created: TOEIC(for Japan) to measure Business English TOEFL to measure Academic English

The tests test different sets of knowledge about the English language. There are similarities, so, both TOEIC and TOEFL in a broad sense measure the KNOWLEDGE of English.

The tests do what they are supposed to do – they measure KNOWLEDGE.



English Communicative Success: This does not work...

TOEIC and TOEFL are not designed to measure communicative ability for Japanese. **Communication has a cultural component that is** difficult to test for. **PROBLEM:** The communicative culture of the Japanese people prevents them from communicating at a level that non-Japanese can understand. Japanese are intelligent. Intelligence is not an issue. The Process is the issue.

SOLUTION: The Standards and The Ultimate



III. Japanese Communicative Success:

This works! The best Japanese oral communicators are the best LISTENERS!

They know what to say because they have listened to enough people to understand their minds and hearts.

Listening is the foundation to great communication in any language.



Japanese Communicative Success: This works!

"English-speaking parents teach their children the names of things; in Asia, they tend to stress emotions and feelings," explained researcher Tetsuo Kobayashi. Source: Baby's Growth Diary, 398 infants between February and April 2007 Japanese as children listen to their mother, father, sister, brother, grandparents, family, friend, Music and TV before they say their first words. Gohan was the first word to be spoken, number 4 was "mama", number 8 was "papa",

as stated by NTT's Communication Science Laboratories.



Japanese Communicative Success: This works!

Japanese communication is based on making statements and a try-by-myself to understand without upsetting the other.

Listening is the key element to understanding. A person has to be a good listener to understand.

If communication is unclear it is common to make a statement so that the other party can respond and hopefully the situation will be clear.



IV. English Communicative Success: This works!

English communication is based on asking questions and the other party is responsible for making himself understood. Emotions and feelings are not-so-important.

LISTENING is the key element to understanding. A person has to be a good listener to understand. Japanese and English are different If communication is unclear it is common to ask questions so that the other party can respond and hopefully the situation will be clear.

Comprehension CHECK!

You did not know THIS! Japanese who live in Japan do not communicate effectively because English speakers in Japan are told to: "Be sensitive and kind to the Japanese way of communicating."

"Speak slowly and use more simple vocabulary."

"Do not require the Japanese to think deeply."

"Do not require the Japanese to explain logically."



Comprehension CHECK!

English speakers who live in Japan: a. talk unnaturally only for Japanese in Japan b. communicate unnaturally only for Japanese

ALL Japanese professionals who go to foreign countries know this is true! Japanese who go to foreign countries almost never understand what the English speakers are saying. English speakers in Japan do not talk like **English speakers who are outside of Japan! Develop the listening and thinking skills in Japan** so that you can communicate in English at anytime, anywhere, and in critical situations.



Comprehension CHECK!

Discuss with an English speaker who is: a. "not sensitive to Japanese culture" b. "not sensitive to Japanese shyness" **English speakers in Japan ARE NOT REAL! REAL English speakers** a. are not-so-sensitive to Japanese culture b. have no-idea about communicative shyness Japanese professionals must communicate in a way that REAL English speakers understand! Understanding the Japanese communicative culture is not important for English speakers! And now is not the time for them to learn.
